POM 3430 OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT Winter 2018

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Operations Management encompasses the fundamental action of an organization -- the provision of goods and services. This course will cover a number of the techniques and methodologies as well as theory related to the design, development, analysis and management of operations. The central concepts of capacity, standards, inventory, scheduling and control will provide the framework within which these techniques and methodologies are introduced.

No make-ups will be scheduled if I am contacted after the quiz or exam has been given. Any short, unannounced quizzes cannot be made up.

I encourage you to work through these problems and think about the various questions, especially in areas that you might be having difficulties in understanding. The solutions to the problems and answers to the discussion questions are available on Moodle.

In this course you will be introduced to a wide variety of problems, issues, concepts, methodologies and techniques which comprise the field of Operations Management. Since a great many of these will be introduced concurrently, it is important that you keep up with the work. I strongly encourage you to review these problems as the material is covered.
