COURSE OVERVIEW

The focus of this course is to introduce students to theoretical principles and therapeutic interventions used in professional nursing practice across the lifespan.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

1. Describe the theoretical principles underlying selected therapeutic interventions used in professional nursing practice.
2. Demonstrate beginning competency performing selected therapeutic interventions in the laboratory setting.
3. Demonstrate understanding of appropriate documentation for therapeutic interventions used in professional nursing practice.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

1. Attendance at all scheduled lab activities, lecture, practice and testing sessions.
2. Completion of the American Technologies Institute (ATI) proctored Fundamentals of Nursing Practice exam.
3. Sound nursing judgments are developed through the application of scientific principles and the development of problem solving skills. To facilitate this process, the student will learn from the scientific rationale that supports the practice of the techniques as well as the execution of the skill.
4. In addition to psychomotor skills, safety, organization and communication techniques will be stressed throughout these modules.
5. The clinical skill modules will guide the learning activities in the LRL. The scientific principles for each clinical skill will be reviewed in print and non-print materials. Demonstration of techniques will occur in a simulated clinical setting. Selected skills will be practiced and evaluated by nursing faculty, graduate assistants, or fellow students.

EVALUATION TECHNIQUES

The grade for NRS 210 will be the average of 5 quizzes. Each quiz accounts for 20% of the grade. Quizzes will be time limited at one (1) minute per question. (Example: A quiz with 20 questions will be allotted 20 minutes) Each quiz may be reviewed by the student by appointment with the faculty for a period of two (2) weeks following the date which the quiz was taken by the student. Students are graded "S" (satisfactory) or "U" (unsatisfactory) on skills in each module. Psychomotor validation involves performing the skill(s) while being observed by faculty or peer. The observer uses the steps outlined in the clinical skill checklist to assure satisfactory performance.

Cell phones may not be used in class to talk, text, or as calculators on quizzes. Calculators, other than those on phones, may be used.

Mid-semester evaluations will be posted per Oakland University policy for 200 level classes on the SAIL system. It is required that the student completes the proctored ATI Fundamentals of Nursing Practice Exam, but this test is not a component of the course grade.

AMERICAN TECHNOLOGIES INSTITUTE (ATI) REQUIREMENT

American Technologies Institute (ATI) proctored test, Fundamentals of Nursing Practice, is a course requirement. The test will be given on the final exam date and time scheduled for the course but will NOT be a component of the course grade. Students are required to prepare for this test by reviewing the ATI content mastery review module, using online resources at www.atitesting.com, and taking the online non-proctored practice tests. Results of the test will be available online and students are required to review the results and complete the remediation activities. This test will provide the student with an assessment of their progress and assist in identifying areas of strength and weakness prior to junior level courses and ultimately, the NCLEX.

REMEDICATION

Students who do not successfully validate their psychomotor knowledge will be required to undertake specific learning activities (remediation) such as readings and audio-visuals, before being retested. Retesting will not be undertaken immediately following an unsuccessful attempt. The student must demonstrate an attempt to increase knowledge or ability before retesting.

This course is designed so that new learning builds on previously acquired knowledge. It is essential that students successfully validate their skills in each module BEFORE moving to the next module. It is also expected that material learned in previous modules will be applied to current modules where appropriate as part of "successful validation".

SKILL MODULE ORGANIZATION

Each Module is organized in the following manner.

Introduction

This explains what the skill entails and discusses how the skill relates to professional nursing practice.

Module Objectives

This indicates what the student will be able to do after successfully completing the module.

Learning Activities

This includes reading assignments, lecture, media, completion of study guide questions and self assessment quiz. Study questions guide the student's progress through the learning activities and stimulate thinking.

Practice Activities

Include a variety of lab or outside activities related to each module. Practice in performing the skills for each module is undertaken during scheduled practice sessions. Use of the skill check sheet supplied in each module will facilitate student practice.

Validation

Involves validating cognitive and psychomotor knowledge of module content. The lab module quiz evaluates students' cognitive knowledge of a skill.
