PREREQUISITES and/or CO-REQUISISTES

Prerequisites: NRS 308, NRS 329, NRS 336, & NRS 452

COURSE OVERVIEW

This course introduces students to basic nursing management and leadership concepts, principles, and tools. This course will focus on the nursing roles of leader, manager, and coordinator of patient-centered care, highlighting how the various roles help facilitate the attainment of positive patient and organizational outcomes.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. Examine health policy and finance-related issues, and their impact on health care systems and professional nursing practice.
- 2. Assess the effect of organizational culture and structure on professional nursing practice.
- 3. Examine issues related to teamwork, collaboration, and inter- and intra-professional communication, and their impact on professional nursing practice.
- 4. Discuss legal and ethical principles foundational to professional nursing practice.
- 5. Explain professional nurses' use of quality and/or safety-related concepts, principles, and methods to ensure safe and effective patient-centered care.

ESSENTIAL CONTENT

Health policy, finance, and regulatory environments

Leadership theories, concepts, skills, and styles that promote quality patient care

Intra- and inter-professional teamwork skills, including delegation and conflict resolution

Legal and ethical principles related to professional nursing practice

Health care systems, organizational cultures and structures, and their relationships to quality patient-centered nursing care and patient safety

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

All e-Learning courses at Oakland University are delivered using a learning management system called Moodle that allows instructors to design entire courses online or to enhance a classroom-based course. The Moodle software resides on a server allowing students to access it via a web browser, e.g. Mozilla, Firefox. COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. **Course Organization:** This course is organized in 3 distinct modules. Those being; Healthcare environment, Quality Care and Skills for Quality Outcomes. The principles of adult learning is used for this course. The following table is outline of how the course topics will progress. This schedule may be adapted or changes as needed. Lecture, case studies, class activities are all methods to explain and apply course content. A variety of evaluation methods are used. Dues dates are posted in the syllabus. All assignments are to be submitted on the appropriate assignment board on the Moodle site, unless otherwise specified by the instructor.
- 2. Attendance: Attendance at lecture is encouraged but no attendance will be taken. Assignments and activities are posted in the syllabus. If students are not able to attend class it is the responsibility of the student to communicate with the faculty to make arrangements for missed content. In class activities cannot be duplicated if a student is unable to be in class, therefore any make up activities will be at the direction of the

faculty. Students have one week of a missed class to contact faculty about missed content.

- **3.** Class preparation: Students are expected to come to class prepared to participate in class/group discussions. Multiple methods are available for students to understand content. Class *may* include iClicker, group activity, surveys or discussion. These activities are designed to assist the student to understand the course concepts. Preparation is essential.
- 4. **Quiz/Exams** Completion of all exams, including the ATI exam is required to receive a course grade. Quizzes will cover the assigned course readings. Dates will be posted and gone over in class. The quizzes will cover material from the text readings.

ATI exam is a requirement to receive a grade for this course. Students are expected to pass this exam with a level 2 or better. If not, remediation is required for students to receive a grade in the course.

- 5. **Leadership Simulation** this course has time in the simulation lab for students to practices skills necessary to deliver quality care. Assignments and outcomes will be posted online.
- 6. **Late Assignments** will be accepted at the discretion of the faculty. Any assignment more than 1 week late will not be accepted.
- 7. **Moodle** will be used for communication outside of the classroom. Students with questions/concerns can use the course email for communication. The faculty reviews emails daily and will make every effort to respond within 48 hours. Lecture notes, hand outs and work sheets will be found on the course website.
