#### **COURSE OVERVIEW**

This course focuses on the theoretical foundations of evidence-based nursing interventions to promote population health and prevent disease in community settings. Plans of care that include holistic health assessments, group and population-based goals and outcomes, health teaching, health counseling, health screening, disease and outbreak investigations, and disaster preparedness across multiple settings in the community will be emphasized. Empirically-based research findings related to health promotion will be analyzed, and used to guide care planning for groups and diverse populations in the community.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

- 1. Apply the nursing process using evidenced-based interventions with community-based groups and diverse populations to attain positive health and wellness outcomes.
- 2. Apply health promotion principles and professional practice guidelines to promote population health, including assessment of genetic factors that affect health and wellness.
- 3. Explore philosophical foundations of health promotion in the community, including the concept of social justice to eliminate health disparities.
- 4. Demonstrate use of principles related to cultural competency with diverse groups across the life-span, including the use of evidence-based complementary therapies.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES (cont'd.)**

- 5. Recognize the importance of collaborating with other healthcare professionals, community groups, and health care consumers and their families to develop optimal plans of care to attain positive health outcomes.
- 6. Integrate relevant evidenced-based interventions and the use of informatics into the delivery of patient-centered community-based wellness care.

#### **TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS**
