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COURSE OVERVIEW

The focus of this course is the analysis of contemporary nursing issues relevant to professional nursing practice. The importance of nursing ethics, the professional image of nursing, professional nursing organizations, and various nursing roles will be analyzed using current nursing literature. Teaching/learning/and change theories and principles will be applied to relevant nursing phenomena identified from nursing practice.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. Analyze contemporary nursing issues
- 2. Explain the importance of nursing ethics and its relationship to professional nursing practice
- 3. Analyze the professional image of nursing today, including the function of professional nursing organizations, using the nursing literature as evidence.
- 4. Evaluate one's personal ability to function in the professional nursing roles of advocate, leader, collaborator, educator, and research consumer.
- 5. Apply teaching/learning/ change theories and principles to clinical nursing phenomena.

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

All e-Learning courses at Oakland University are delivered using a learning management system called Moodle that allows instructors to design entire courses online or to enhance a classroom-based course. The Moodle software resides on a server allowing students to access it via a web browser, e.g. Mozilla, Firefox. Course Policies:

1. General Policies:

All policies and procedures found in the Oakland University catalog and School of Nursing handbook will apply for this course.

2. Academic Conduct Policy:

All members of the academic community at Oakland University are expected to practice and uphold standards of academic integrity and honesty. Academic integrity means representing oneself and one's work honestly. Misrepresentation is cheating since it means students are claiming credit for ideas or work not actually theirs and are thereby seeking a grade that is not actually earned. Following are some examples of academic dishonesty:

- a. Cheating on examinations. This includes using materials such as books and/or notes when not authorized by the instructor, copying from someone else's paper, helping someone else copy work, substituting another's work as one's own, theft of exam copies, or other forms of misconduct on exams.
- b. Plagiarizing the work of others. Plagiarism is using someone else's work or ideas without giving that person credit; by doing this, students are, in effect, claiming credit for someone else's thinking. Whether students have read or heard the information used, they must document the source of information. When dealing with written sources, a clear distinction should be made between quotations (which reproduce information from the source word-for-word within quotation marks) and paraphrases (which digest the source of information and produce it in the student's own words). Both direct quotations and paraphrases must be documented. Even if students rephrase, condense or select from another person's work, the ideas are still the other person's, and failure to give credit constitutes misrepresentation of the student's actual work and plagiarism of another's ideas. Buying a paper or using information from the World Wide Web or Internet without attribution and handing it in as one's own work is plagiarism.
- c. Cheating on lab reports by falsifying data or submitting data not based on the student's own work.
- d. Falsifying records or providing misinformation regarding one's credentials.

e. Unauthorized collaboration on computer assignments and unauthorized access to and use of computer programs, including modifying computer files created by others and representing that work as one's own.

Assignments:

To begin this course, you will be asked to introduce yourself in a **discussion forum format**. This will give me an idea of your background and will allow you to know who your classmates are in this course.

As you will be required to follow APA format guidelines, a brief **quiz regarding APA format** will be included.

Four modules of this course are designed to prompt the student to draw on the curriculum to date, clinical practice, and other resources and experiences to summarize and personalize the role/s of the generalist nurse. The assignments include written papers and discussion forums.

Details of the assignments with grading schemes will be available in Moodle.

Assignments should adhere to the APA (6th ed.) format, e.g. use 12-font, Times New Roman text, double-spaced, with one-inch margins all around. Assignment length (number of pages) will be defined in Moodle. Anything written beyond the defined length will not be read or graded.

References must be empirically based, retrievable, and from nursing literature. *Please refer to the posted APA Resource for Assignment Completion*.

Submission of Assignments:

All course assignments should be submitted through Moodle only, as Word documents. If I am unable to open your assignment, it will be returned to you.

All assignments must have a title page with running head and pagination when indicated. References (if required) for each assignment must be on a separate page from the text, consistent with APA guidelines. Credit for APA will be denied if all items are not included on each assignment.

No assignment will be accepted after the due date/time. All assignments turned in after the due date/time will receive a 20% point reduction for each day they are overdue, including the due date if they are not submitted on time. If you have a dilemma ahead of the due date/time, please contact me via Moodle email.

The instructor determines all final points for assignments. Please allow at least one week following due dates for grades to be posted.

Drafts will not be accepted for any of the course assignments. Revisions will not be accepted unless specified.

Extra credit points are not awarded unless a minimum of 2.5 is earned in the class.
